INTERNATIONAL

1) Havana Syndrome

A new report on Havana syndrome (a mysterious illness that afflicted hundreds of United States diplomats and intelligence officials worldwide) has brought renewed attention to microwave weapons. Havana Syndrome refers to a set of mental health symptoms. It was first reported by officials based in the U.S. embassy in Cuba in 2016.

2) Lassa fever

Lassa fever is zoonotic disease caused by Lassa virus. It was first discovered in 1969 in Nigeria. It is endemic in parts of West Africa. It spreads through Infected rats. Ribavirin an antiviral drug that is used for its treatment and maintaining hydration, oxygen levels etc.

NATIONAL

1) National Health Authority

NHA is working on integrating SECC 2011 beneficiary database with National Food Security Act (NFSA), to enable beneficiaries to seek information regarding their entitlement under the Ayushman Bharat Pradhan Mantri - Jan Arogya Yojana (AB PM-JAY) using their ration card number.

2) InspireSat-1 satellite

ISRO sent 2 small satellites aboard Polar satellite launch vehicle (PSLV-C52). InspireSat-1 satellite to study ionosphere dynamics and the Sun's coronal heating process. INS-2DT has a thermal imaging camera and can help in assessment of land and water surface temperatures and in mapping vegetation and thermal inertia (day and night).

3) Medaram Jathara

Ministry of Tribal Affairs has sanctioned 2.26 Crores for Medaram Jathara. It is the secondlargest fair of India, after the Kumbh Mela. It is biennially celebrated and organized by the Koyas tribes in collaboration with Telangana government.

4) Ban on Chinese Apps

The government of India has banned 54 apps of Chinese origin citing security concerns. The apps include Sea Ltd.'s marquee game Free Fire and other apps related to tech firms like Tencent, Alibaba and NetEase. The apps were banned by the Ministry of Electronics and Information Technology are re-branded versions of apps banned by India in 2020. Free Fire is often compared with PUBG.

The Indian mining major Vedanta has tied up with Taiwanese electronics manufacturing company, Hon Hai Technology Group (better known as Foxconn) to form a joint venture for manufacturing semiconductors in India.

Sandeep Bakhshi has been named the Business Standard Banker of the Year 2020-21. He is the managing director and chief executive officer of ICICI Bank. The winner was chosen by a jury of 5 members chaired by former Reserve Bank of India deputy governor S S Mundra.
